


Pre Service Music

Confession and Absolution


P: Into this world of sin You came, Lord Jesus, to redeem us from its curse. Tonight we confess to You our part in bringing this curse upon You, for we deserved its punishment.

C: We confess before You on this night of beauty the ugliness of our sin. Candles may light the sanctuary, but the light of our faith is often dim. Joy fills our songs, but our hearts remain troubled by guilt. Your love shines out, but the darkness of our unloving nature invades our minds. How we long for Your saving grace—Your Spirit to warm our faith, Your love to fill our hearts, Your forgiveness to remove our guilt. We repent of our sin. For the sake of Jesus, who was born for us, lived for us, and died for us; grant us forgiveness.

(Silence for Reflection)

P: The time has come for you to throw off your guilt and pain and to rejoice in God's forgiving love. For Jesus' sake, God has forgiven you all your sins, and His Spirit empowers you to greater service. In the name of the Father and of and † Son and of the Holy Spirit, rejoice in your forgiveness and sing for joy:

Isaiah 7:10-14

¹⁰Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, ¹¹"Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven." ¹²But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test." ¹³And he said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary men, that you weary my God also? ¹⁴Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel."

Matthew 1:18-25

¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. ²⁰But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²²All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: ²³"Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son,and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us). ²⁴When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him: he took his wife, ²⁵but knew her not until she had given birth to a son. And he called his name Jesus.





Psalm 96

- P: Sing to the LORD, praise His name; proclaim His salvation day after day.
- C: Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
- P: Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous deeds among all people.
- C: Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
- P: For great is the LORD and most worthy of praise; He is to be feared above all gods. For all the gods of the nations are idols, but the LORD made the heavens. Splendor and majesty are before Him; strength and glory are in His sanctuary.
- C: Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the earth.
- P: Ascribe to the LORD, O families of nations, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength. Ascribe to the LORD the glory due His name; bring an offering and come into His courts.

Luke 2:1-7

¹In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³And all went to be registered, each to his own town. ⁴And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he

was of the house and lineage of David, ⁵to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. ⁶And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. ⁷And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.



Luke 2:8-15

⁸And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. ¹⁰And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy that will be for all the people. ¹¹For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. ¹²And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." ¹³And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest,and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" ¹⁵When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,

P: The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make His face to shine upon and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace


C: Amen!
