Good Friday Thoughts

Tenebrae: Tonight's service of darkness, also known as Tenebrae (*the name means "darkness" or "shadows"*), is a Holy Week devotion that dates back to the seventh or eighth century A.D. and is characterized by the successive extinguishing of candles as the service progresses. It is done to symbolize the darkness of our sins that put Him up on that cross. It also reminds us of the three hours of darkness that covered the whole land while Jesus was dying.

The Focus of the service is squarely on the cross of Christ where He suffered the agony of death as full payment for the sins of the world. This service is designed so that you can spend most of this time with eyes upward, looking at the cross, the symbol of Christ's most compelling sacrifice for you.

Because of the Solemnity of the service, you are requested to remain silent while in the nave of the Church (*where we gather together to worship*). It is for this reason – out of respect for Christ's suffering and death – that we do not have any pre-service or post-service music. Use the time of silence in prayer to God and personal reflection. There will be no invocation or benediction on Good Friday because we are continuing the service from Maundy Thursday into Easter Sunday.


Your Offerings may be placed in the offering plates located in the back of the church after the service.

 I cling by faith to Thee.



HYMN: "Jesus, in Your Dying Woes" #447 vs. 1-3




- Reader 1: Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?"

 Jesus answered, "I tell you not seven times, but seventy-seven times."

 (Matthew 18:21-22).
- Reader 2: Two other men, both criminals, were also led out with Him to be executed. When they came to the place called the Skull, there they crucified Him, along with the criminals one on His right, the other on His left. Jesus said, "Father forgive them, for they do no know what they are doing." (Luke 23:32-34).

II. LOVE'S REWARD




Reader 1: (Jesus said), When the Son of Man comes in His glory and all the angels with Him, He will sit on His throne in heavenly glory. All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on His right and the goats on His left. Then the King will say to those on His right: 'Come, you who are blessed by My Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers

Reader 2: ³⁹One of the criminals who hung there hurled insults at him; "Aren't you the Christ? Save yourself and us!" ⁴⁰But the other criminal rebuked him. "Don't you fear God," he said, "since you are under the same sentence? ⁴¹We are punished justly, for we are getting what our deeds deserve. But this man has done nothing wrong." ⁴²Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ⁴³Jesus answered him, "I tell you the truth, today you will be with me in paradise." (Luke 23:39-43)


III. LOVE'S CONCERN



Reader 1: ⁴⁶While Jesus was still talking to the crowd, his mother and brothers stood outside, wanting to speak to him. ⁴⁷Someone told him, 'Your mother and brothers are standing outside, wanting to speak to you." ⁴⁸He replied to him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?" ⁴⁹Pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. ⁵⁰For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." (Matthew 12:46-50).

Reader 2: ²⁵Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. ²⁶When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple who he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, "Dear woman, here is your son," ²⁷and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home. (John 19:25-27).


IV. LOVE'S PRESENCE



Reader 1: ¹⁶Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. ¹⁷When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. ¹⁸Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. ¹⁹Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:16-20)

Reader 2: ³³At the sixth hour darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour. ³⁴And at the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, Iama sabachthani?" – which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (Mark 15:33-34).


V. LOVE'S NEED



Reader 1: ³⁷On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. ³⁸Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him." (John 7:37-38).

Reader 2: ²⁸Later, knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." ²⁹A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. (John 19:28-29).


VI. LOVE'S COMPLETION



Reader 1: ³¹Jesus took the Twelve aside and told them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written by the prophets about the Son of Man will be fulfilled. ³²He will be handed over to the Gentiles. They will mock him, insult him, spit on him, flog him and kill him. ³³On the third day he will rise again." ³⁴The disciples did not understand any of this. Its meaning was hidden from them, and they did not know what he was talking about. (Luke 18:31-34).

Reader 2: ³⁰When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." (John 19:30a).

VII. LOVE'S INVITATION



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Reader 1: ²⁵At that time Jesus said, ²⁸"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. ²⁹Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (Matthew 11:25a, 28-30).

Reader 2: ⁴⁴It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour, ⁴⁵for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last. (Luke 23:44-46)

THE TEARING OF THE CURTAIN:

This is to remind us of when the curtain of the temple was torn it two from top to bottom – the moment Jesus gave up His spirit.

THE EARTHQUAKE:


This is to remind us of the earthquake that caused the earth to shake and rocks to split. The tombs broke open and the bodies of many holy people were raised to life.

THE TOLLING OF THE BELL:

It is rung 33 times, each time for one year of Jesus' life here on earth. Ponder and meditate upon the life, ministry, suffering, domination, and death of Christ. Meditate on Christ's final words as He hung on the cross.

THE ROLLING OF THE STONE:

This is to indicate the death of the Son of God and the closing of the tomb as He was buried in the grave.



THE CHRIST CANDLE IS LIT:

This is done in anticipation of our Lord's imminent resurrection.

(Everyone may leave silently in respect for the suffering and death of our Savior. We mediate on the price paid throughout the Passion of Jesus with our eyes pointed toward His resurrection.)
