The Lord's Supper

Christ Jesus intends to strengthen and improve our fellowship with Him and one another through the proper practice of Holy Communion. We must examine ourselves as to whether we truly repent of our sins and believe in the Real Presence of Christ's body and blood under the bread and wine. Also, any refusal to forgive and love our neighbor must be disowned, for in the Sacrament we are most fully at one with Christ and one another, and so we may bring no contradiction of this with us to the Sacrament. There are helpful questions and answers to assist in preparing for the Sacrament, in the hymnal on pages 329-330. *There are also helpful prayers in the hymnal on page 308.

If you are a guest from a sister Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod congregation, we invite you to commune with us. Please speak with the pastor or an elder so we may notify your church that you celebrated the Sacrament with us.

Ash Wednesday Thoughts

Out of respect for those around you, please remain quiet. Use this time for silent contemplation and meditation.

Remember, my friends, that we are dust and to dust we will return (Genesis 3:19).

Ashes have always reminded God's people that they will not live forever. God offers us His promise in the cross of Jesus Christ. Let's let go of the "things" of this life for the sake of God's promises.

Participating in the custom of receiving the sign of the cross with ashes on your forehead witnesses to the world what you believe about your death and resurrection in Jesus Christ. These ashes come from the palms of last Palm Sunday. This is symbolic of what Jesus processed into Jerusalem to do for you – namely take all of your sins upon Himself on the cross. As you rejoiced last Palm Sunday with His coming to you to save you, you now wear that mark of your salvation upon your forehead.

During Lent, keep talking to God, asking Him to accomplish in you the work of His salvation so that you may show forth God's glory in the world and experience always the joy of Christ's resurrection. *Pastor Awe.*

P: The ashes in this bowl are from last year's palms from Palm Sunday. If it is your desire, we invite you to participate in the custom of receiving the sign of the cross with ashes on your forehead.

(At this time, congregation approaches the altar. As the ashes are applied, Pastor says:)

- P: Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Lord, let these ashes be a reminder to us that we are dust. May this be a mark of our repentance. Bless all those who receive these ashes this day. May they keep this Lenten season in preparation for the joy of Easter. We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

- C: And renew a right spirit within me.


(Silence for Reflection)

PRAYER OF THE CHURCH

O Lord our God, the Father of mercies, You have no pleasure in the death of the P: wicked, but desire that the wicked turn from their way and live. For His sake hear all who cry to You in sorrow and distress, and deliver them according to their need and Your abundant mercy. Bestow Your blessing upon the ministry of reconciliation. May the preaching of the cross become a message of peace and the very power of Your Gospel unto the ends of the earth, that all the nations may be delivered from the darkness of their sins and glorify Your gracious name with all Your saints in light. Grant courage and strength to the ministers of Your Word to preach Christ and Him crucified, both in season and out of season, calling sinners to repentance and believers to rejoice in Your salvation. May the death of Your Son be our comfort in our last hour, and let us depart in peace to rise with Him to life everlasting; for He lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

THE WORDS OF OUR LORD





DISTRIBUTION


(The pastor and those who assist him receive the body and blood of Christ first and then distribute them to those who come to receive, saying:)

Take, eat; this is the true body of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, given into death for your sins.






